Target Market Summary

This product is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking **income distribution** and may potentially receive **capital growth** to be used as a **core allocation** within a portfolio where the consumer has a **medium** investment timeframe, **low/medium** risk/return profile and needs **daily** access to capital.

Instructions

Investment products and diversification
